E. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Duties and responsibilities of students	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. During the course program (if no change is notified by the relevant faculty member during the clerkship period), students are expected to fully present for theoretical or practical application. According to the regulation, there is an attendance requirement of 70% in theoretical courses and 80% in applied courses in Phase V.2. Although there is no directive of the medical faculty regarding dress, all students are expected to perform personal care and dress with a style and care worthy of a physician candidate during all practical and theoretical training hours.3. It is expected to be worn a white coat in all practical trainings.4. A whatsapp group is formed and daily program follow-up via whatsapp.5. All students are registered to the Forensic Medicine Internship Distance Education System from the Course Management System. Before the internship begins, students are expected to enter the system, obtain information about the curriculum, applications and assessment and be prepared for the internship by using the resources provided.6. Every morning, the trainer announces via whatsapp the students will participate to the autopsy or polyclinic practice. Students are expected to fully participate in autopsy / polyclinic practices.7. Autopsy is performed in Muğla Forensic Medicine Branch Office in Yerkesik. Transportation will be provided by the university service. The student representative is expected to communicate with the shuttle driver.8. Polyclinic practice is performed Muğla Research and Training Hospital, Forensic Medicine Outpatient Clinic. Students are expected to be ready in the outpatient clinic at 8.30.9. Students are responsible for completing the Clerkship log book.10. Writing a forensic report of a simulated case will be done on the trauma model.11. Watching the educational film, short training videos together and discussion activities will be held at appropriate times during the internship.
